

# Brunelleschi Lifetime Achievement Award Nomination Guidelines

The Brunelleschi Lifetime Achievement Award is the highest individual honor DBIA bestows. It is presented to individuals who have made significant contributions to the design and construction industry through outstanding leadership and innovation in the advancement of design-build project delivery. Recipients of this award have exhibited originality, vision and breadth over the course of their professional life, with 30 years or more of strong and well-documented commitment to design-build project delivery.

## Nominations Due: Monday, August 19, 2024, 5:00PM ET

Submitters will be notified of the applicant's status by early September.

Before submitting your **online nomination**, below is the information you will need to supply for your nominee. Please note, once you begin filling out the online form, you will not be able to save and come back to it. Please be sure to gather all of the following information prior to starting your online submission:

# Nominee Overview

- Is the nominee retired or planning to retire within the next two (2) years.
- How many years has the nominee been promoting the value, use and/or best practices associated with design-build project delivery? (Minimum of 30 years required to be considered)
- In 300 words or less, provide an overview of the nominee's career that describes the relevance of the nominee's professional career to the advancement of successful design-build, including the earliest demonstration (year) of this commitment.
- Provide up to five (5) examples of service and/or work product over nominee's career that have contributed to either the advancement of design-build and/or the application of Design-Build Done Right<sup>®</sup> principles and practices. Each should be 150 words or less.
- List up to five (5) noteworthy design-build projects in which the nominee has been involved, including the nominee's role on project team, any awards won for the project, and any notable achievements on the project.

Include as part of the testimonial how the nominee embodies the attributes and characteristics of a true design-build leader (collaborative, collegial, creative, innovative, etc.) and leads by professional and personal example.

- DBIA will produce a video of the Brunelleschi winner for use during the award presentation. Please
  provide contact information for up to five (5) family members and/or professionals who can provide us
