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

Driving the Future: How Emerging Technologies Are Shaping Tomorrow's World

Closing General Session Current Update of BABA Requirements in Design-Build Projects

The Build America Buy America Act (BABA), included in the IIJA, states "none of the funds made available for a Federal financial assistance program for infrastructure... may be obligated for a project unless all of the iron, steel, manufactured products and construction materials used in the project are produced in the United States." In this panel discussion, EPA's Office of Water Domestic Preference Implementation team will provide practical guidance to ensure compliance with these standards for its SRF, WIFIA and other OW programs. Hear examples of how design-build delivery and supply chain volatility can be affected by these requirements from the viewpoints of an Owner and contractor who have had to work within the requirements of the act.




